

Colored Pencil Painters Guild Emerging Artists Exhibits Show Rules  
11/19/2016

Acceptance:

1. Colored pencil artwork by CPPG members in good standing shall be accepted in the Emerging Artists Exhibit (EAE) if the artist has never entered any media in any shows, and meets all other eligibility rules. Artists may enter new paintings in future EAEs until they win an award in this show.
2. These exhibits shall be held in March during the monthly meetings of the CPPG.
3. Once a painting receives an award in an EAE, that artist cannot submit other paintings in these shows, but must move up to the CPPG Judged Shows. However, artists are not required to enter EAE prior to entering a Judged show or Exhibit.
4. Due to local governmental policy, art of political, religious and nudity subjects will not be accepted for exhibits.
5. Maximum size of paintings cannot exceed 42" x 42". There is no minimum size, and trading cards shall be accepted, provided they follow all other rules.

Media:

Artwork must be all colored pencil. Colored pencil artwork includes colored pencils, watercolor pencils, and watercolor crayons. No mixed media, charcoal, graphite, or gouache may be used. (It is permissible to use graphite for purposes of sketching your painting prior to adding colored pencils. Also, see "What is Colored Pencil – Revisited" on the website under the Home page.)

Condition of Submitted Artwork:

All artwork must be properly matted and clean, but framing is not required.

Entry and Removal:

1. There is no required advance registration or entry fee. However, participants may sign up during the January and February monthly meetings.
2. The artist must provide his/her own table easel.
3. Paintings and easels will be placed on a designated table between 9:00 – 9:30 a.m. Late entries cannot be accepted.
4. Artists will remove his/her painting at the end of the monthly meeting.
5. A CPPG ID card will be placed on the table in front of each painting.
6. One painting per artist shall be accepted.

Voting:

1. Each member can vote only once; artists who submit paintings in the exhibit may also vote.
2. Voting will begin at 9:30 a.m. and conclude by 9:45 a.m.
3. The EAE Chair and Co-chair will count the written ballots during the business part of the meeting.
4. EAE ribbons will be awarded for 1st Place, 2nd Place, and 3rd Place, based on the vote count. Most votes = 1st Place, etc.
5. In the event of a tie, there will be two ribbons presented for those award categories.
6. Winners will be announced at the end of the business meeting.

Following the announcement of winners, a constructive critique will be offered for all paintings. This critique will be given by a CPPG Art Instructor.
