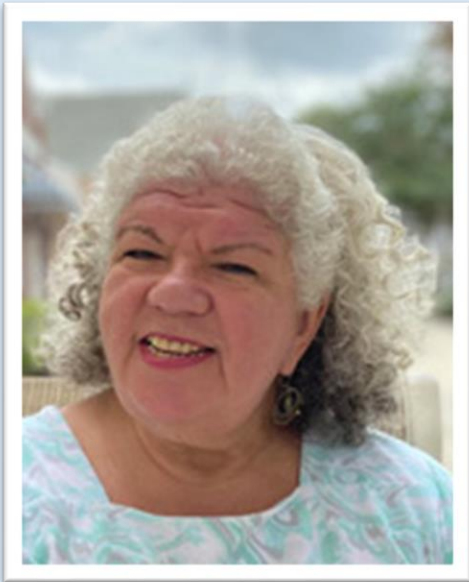




# CPPG COLORED PENCIL POINTS

## Do You Know – Sandy Phillips

Did you know that colors have temperatures? Don't call the doctor if a color is warm or the undertaker if a color is cool or worse, cold. Cool colors, warm colors, oh my. Many know warm colors are colors of the sun or fire, that is yellows, oranges, and reds, while cool colors are the color of the sea, blues, turquoise and purples.

Warm greens and cool greens. Hey, they both are green what's the big deal? One day my husband tried to show his independence by wearing a lime green golf shirt with a peacock blue pair of shorts. It was a scratch your nails on the board outfit. Clash, clash. A cool green has more "blue" mixed into it and a warm green has more yellow mixed into it. But the cool green can be subtle, like a jade green. And a warm green might be a grass green.

Let's look at the two rose pics below:

The leaves of the left red rose are warm. Look carefully and see the yellow especially in the light areas.

On the right pink rose the leaves are cool. Again, look carefully at the light areas and one should see a jade or blue color green.



So ok now I know what a cool green is, and a warm green is and that most of the time don't mix them when dressing oneself. But there is a lot to know when placing cool colors or warm colors in a painting. There are some guidelines. Cool colors recede and are often placed in the back or under warm colors. Warm colors come forward.



In this famous floral the warm "yellower" leaves are on the forefront.

Look at the leaves in the lower right. The leaves behind it are cool or bluer. Of course, rules are mostly a guide. A warm leaf can be pushed to the back of a painting by making it a darker value of the warm leaf. But let's not go there now.



In this palette knife oil painting the warm leaf is in the forefront on the right. Cool colors are in the back on the left



And lastly this color pencil painting places warm leaves in the front and cool leaves in the back or under the front leaves.

So, it doesn't matter what medium one uses to paint. Using a guideline of warm in front and cool in back is a "good rule of thumb".

Our next Judged Show will be **May 4, 2024**. Your entry will need to be checked in on May 4 from 7:30 to 8:30 am. This is also the time for picking up work entered in our February show.

The judging will be completed before noon on May 4th and on Sunday, May 5th, 2022 we will have a reception for members of CPPG and the public to view the entries.

Remember that all works must be from an original photograph taken by the artist or one that the photographer has given permission for you to use. This includes photos taken by Ronnie Clark and posted on Facebook under "The Villages Friendly Folks" page. If you use one of Ron Clark's photos, please send him a photograph of your painting.

Your paintings must also be 100% colored pencil. When you have completed your painting, please take a

## Library – Lynn Locke

We received some new library books at the last guild meeting. Please stop by the Library table and check them out.

Book of the Month Review: We actually have two books I am recommending; "Drawing Made Easy: Landscapes in Colored Pencil" by Eileen Sorg and "Painting Seaside Scenes with Acrylics" by Jacqueline Penney.

I have found creating land and sea scapes with colored pencil more challenging as compared to watercolor painting them. After a recent colored pencil class given by Cathy Stone and Kathy Guido entitled "Exploring Landscapes in Color Pencil" I have changed my opinion. They demonstrated that painting landscapes with colored pencils such as mountains, rocks, trees & bushes, skies, and water can be created by learning the various techniques such as developing the shadows, realistic textures and how to encompass light and time of day through complex color combinations through layering and blending.

The two books in this month's book review will teach you how to render a variety of scenes with colored pencil. Both books can be helpful for all levels and beginners will find them easy to follow and fun to do. While the second book, "Paint Charming Seaside Scenes with Acrylics" is for acrylic painting, it can easily be used when working with colored pencils. Both books provide step-by-step instructions along with a gallery of photos for each project illustrating the progression of the scene.

If you love land and sea scapes, these books are for you!
