Colored Pencil Cruise 2025 – Peter Kushner

Pencil Painters Cruise: Mattea, Peter, Pat, AJ and others had the pleasure of touring the Celebrity Equinox on Saturday, January 11th. The ship is beautiful and has been refurbished since its 2009 grand opening. The classroom can be divided into two sections with large displays in each section. Bonny and Pat have been asked to put together a supply list so all attendees will have lots of time to get any missing supplies. Pat was also asked for the example of the portrait she will be teaching; she said she is currently working on the portrait.

The glassblowing studio is right next to the lawn on one of the top decks. Students in the glassblowing classes may choose one of 12 projects to create; all of which look really nice. The spa is really nice with heated, tiled, stationary lounge chairs as well as a nice indoor pool. The spa is freely available to all people staying in Aqua class staterooms.

We were treated to a free lunch which was delicious - we are all going to experience a real treat onboard.

Are you aware of the recent incident involving a highly regarded local artist whose original masterpiece was stolen and is now being sold for over \$3,000 without her consent or compensation?

This unfortunate situation underscores the pressing need for artists to be vigilant in safeguarding their work, especially in the age of social media and advanced technologies like AI. We invest considerable time and effort in crafting our beautiful creations, and the thought of seeing them sold elsewhere under someone else's name is disheartening.

To protect yourself, consider implementing the following measures:

- 1) Adjust Privacy Settings on Social Media: Take control of who can access your artwork by reviewing and adjusting privacy settings. For instance, on Facebook:
 - a. Click your profile picture on the top right corner.
 - b. Navigate to Photos, then Albums
 - c. Select the desired album and click Edit Album
 - d. Adjust the privacy setting to your preference (e.g., Friends).
 - e. Save the changes.
- 2) Watermark Your Artwork: Utilize watermarks to add an extra layer of protection to your images. Explore various watermarking options, such as the Watermark app. Keep in mind that while watermarks provide some defense, they can still be removed from photos.
- 3) **Mitigate Damages**: Assess the extent of the situation and decide how far you want to pursue corrective action.
- 4) **Remember,** the paramount objective is to keep creating and expressing your artistic vision. Don't allow concerns about plagiarism to hinder your passion for producing beautiful art. Stay inspired and continue contributing your unique perspective to the world.

Lake Okahumpka – Meg Hay/Peter Kushner




Featured Artist Jane Bowman — Bob Galbraith











