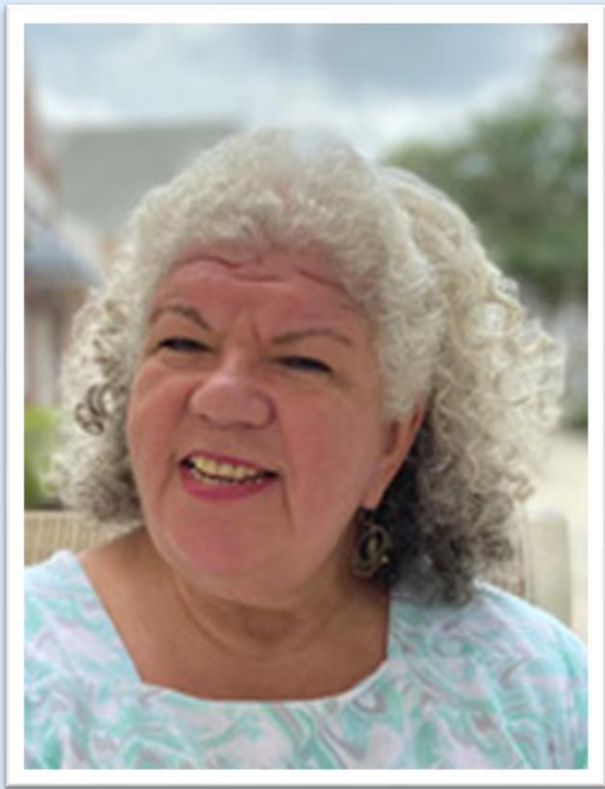




# CPPG COLORED PENCIL POINTS

Our book review for January is "Watercolor Painting Smart" by Al Stine. If you love landscapes, this is the book for you. While it is a watercolor book, it has all the same demonstrated techniques that a colored pencil book would have and can be easily followed using colored pencil. It has a section on the basics of design, color theory, and technique. The author includes 30 step-by-step demonstrations of how to apply the principles of painting smart. He starts with a well-defined sketch focusing on the landscape and painting through the details, always focusing on the center of interest. He takes you through the completion of the underpainting such as removing any applied mask, adding life into the sky and water, and any other details that would result in a captivating painting.

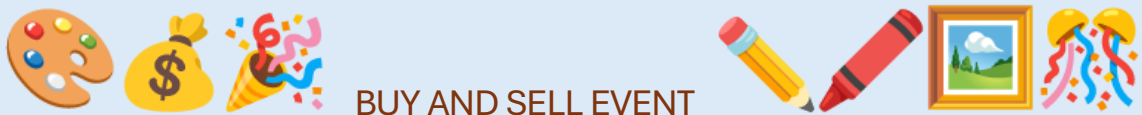
## Programs - Pat Buckert & Jane Stankewicz
